RIVERSIDE COUNTY'S 10 YEAR PLAN TO END HOMELESSNESS KEY RECOMMENDATIONS

The County of Riverside's 10-Year Plan to End Homelessness provides key recommendations that when implemented will significantly reduce homelessness in Riverside County. The plan focuses on the following activities: Strengthening Homeless Prevention Efforts; Expanding Existing Homeless Services; Ending Chronic Homelessness; and Developing Affordable Housing.

- 1. Emergency Shelter Beds** - create 150 additional shelter beds, spread out throughout the County, for individuals living on the streets and require participation in a case management plan as a condition of admission.
- 2. Transitional Housing Beds** - create 75 additional transitional housing units consisting of 225 beds to serve families who are living on the streets and require participation in a case management plan as a condition of admission.
- 3. Permanent Supportive Housing** - create at least 100 beds or units of permanent supportive housing for chronic homeless persons annually for the next five (5) years for a total of 500 units.
- 4. Permanent Affordable Housing** - develop 1,500 units of permanent affordable housing for low-income families and individuals.
