

<p><u>4b. 2016 HUD CoC Program Application Review and Evaluation Process:</u></p>	<p>Jill Kowalski, DPSS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Review and Evaluation Process has been sent out to the CoC for comments four separate times. The document was sent to the BoG for review prior to the meeting. In the CoC Governance Charter, it says that the BoG is responsible for approving the annual HUD Consolidated Application recommendations and process. • The current Review Process is based on the 2015 Review Panel Process, but those are subject to change once the 2016 NOFA is released. <p><i>Motion was made by Steve Falk to approve the 2016 HUD Application Review and Evaluation Process for the County of Riverside Continuum of Care to be updated and amended when the 2016 HUD CoC Program NOFA is released. Brenda Freeman seconded the motion.</i></p> <p><i>Roll Call Vote: Yay – 9; Nay – 0; Abstained – 0. Motion carried.</i></p>
<p><u>4c. 2016 HUD CoC Program Application Permanent Housing Scorecard:</u></p>	<p>Jill Kowalski, DPSS</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Handouts for this agenda item included the HUD Application review timeline, the Permanent Supportive Housing Scorecard, Scoring Summary Sheet for Southern CA CoCs for 2016, and the CoC Program Competition Debriefing for Riverside City and County CoC. • Whiteside Manor, which received more than \$900,000 annually each year in our Continuum, was defunded by HUD in the 2015 CoC Competition. We also did not receive the Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) Bonus as we did in the 2014CoC Competition; other local CoCs did receive a PSH bonus this year. HUD took \$155 million away from Transitional Housing Projects across the nation. • Dr. Joe Colletti of Institute for Urban Initiatives presented on HUD’s 2015 NOFA scoring. He explained that if a CoC is submitting an application that is not competitive, it will not be funded. He also discussed how important it is for our CoC to continue to monitor and reallocate any unspent funds by the CoC projects. • DPSS released a local Request for Proposal on June 8 for new projects to be included in the 2016 HUD application even though the 2016 NOFA has not yet been released. The RFP is due on Aug. 3. • Project Ranking will take place following the release of the NOFA. • There is a non-mandatory bidder’s conference on July 20th. • The next Review Panel Meeting is on July 13th. <p><i>Motion was made by Steve Falk to approve the 2016 HUD Application Permanent Housing scorecard to be used as part of the 2016 Review and Evaluation Process for the County of Riverside Continuum of Care to be updated and amended when the 2016 HUD CoC Program NOFA is released. Melissa Conrad seconded the motion. Roll Call Vote: Yay – 9; Nay – 0; Abstained – 0. Motion carried.</i></p>
<p><u>4d. 2016 HUD CoC Program Application Review and Evaluation Process for Transitional Housing Projects:</u></p>	<p>Angelina Coe, Independent Review Panel Co-chair</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • HUD has been saying that Transitional Housing (TH) is not recommended. • We have 3 TH projects left in our Continuum. • The Review Panel recommendation is that the BOG reallocate funding from the 3 remaining TH projects to fund new projects in the 2016 CoC Program Competition. <p><i>Motion was made by Brenda Freeman to approve the 2016 HUD Application Independent Review Panel’s recommendation to reallocate funding for three (3) Transitional Housing renewal projects in the 2016 HUD CoC Program Consolidated Application to fund new projects to be included in the application. A total of \$716,000 will be reallocated from transitional housing projects from Operation SafeHouse, ABC Recovery</i></p>

		<i>Center, Inc. and Martha's Village and Kitchen (MVK). Leticia DeLara seconded the motion. Roll Call Vote: Yay – 9; Nay – 0; Abstained – 0. Motion carried.</i>
<u>4e. 2016 HUD CoC Program Application Review and Evaluation Process for Housing First:</u>	Angelina Coe, Independent Review Panel Co-chair	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Angelina acknowledged the need for other funding sources aside from the funding received through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). • The Review Panel recommendation is that we reallocate the funds from agencies that are not implementing Housing First. • Valley Restart Shelter was not able to do Housing First and chose to rescind their letter of intent to apply for the 2016 Notice of Funding Availability. <p>Motion was made by Melissa Conrad to reallocate funding from any renewal HUD CoC Program project that is not doing Housing First and cannot answer affirmatively that the project is doing Housing First based on the questions in the 2015 and 2016 HUD application. Karyn Young-Lowe seconded the motion. *Brenda Freeman has left the meeting; the Board confirmed that there is still a quorum. Roll Call Vote: Yay – 8; Nay – 0; Abstained – 0. Motion carried.</p>

CoC-wide Systems Performance Measures:</u>	Dr. Joe Colletti, Institute for Urban Initiatives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • HUD has made it clear that a CoC will not be considered competitive if it has not established System Performance Measures. • Dr. Colletti presented a PowerPoint presentation: “CoC-wide System Performance Measures”. He reviewed and explained the 7 System Performance measures that a CoC needs to meet. <p><u>System Performance Measures:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Length of time persons remain homeless; 2. The extent to which persons who exit homelessness to permanent housing destinations return to homelessness; 3. Number of homeless persons; 4. Jobs and income growth for homeless persons in CoC Program-funded projects; 5. Number of persons who become homeless for the first time; 6. Homelessness prevention and housing placement of persons defined by Category 3 of HUD’s homeless definition in CoC Program-funded projects; (Measure 6 is not applicable for any CoCs to meet at this time) 7. Successful housing placement.
