The goal was for DPSS to have an objective and transparent process. Non-conflicted county departments and community stakeholders assisted in the review process. A total of 42 applications were received and 36 proposals passed threshold: 3 Youth Projects, 9 Capital Improvement; 24 Service Projects. Each proposal was reviewed by two to three reviewers who all signed non-disclosure agreements.
